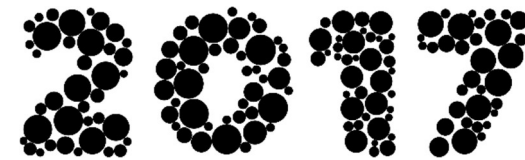


So where Did We See the Harvest during VBS week?


