Pregnant how can she be pregnant. I was at first furious, hurt, disappointed I didn't want it to be a big scandal, but I knew I needed to divorce her quickly and quietly. Then it happened God's messenger appeared and to me and told me to not be afraid to take Mary as my wife and that child she carried was from God. -Joseph of Nazareth

The night started out like any other night. We had all settled in our own spots for the evening, keeping careful watch over the flock making sure no intruders or predators gained access to the sheep. Then it happened a bright light filled the sky and a messenger from God appeared to tell us the Savior had been born, the promised Messiah. Then one bright light became many as there was a whole host of Angels in the sky singing; "Glory to God in the highest," -Shepherd outside Bethlehem

Mary, Joseph and the Shepherds in a field, each had a different experience revolving around the birth of our Savior. Okay, so maybe these three didn't use these exact words when they shared their experience of encountering God in their lives, but their experiences became a part of who they were and part of their story. Can you imagine being one of the shepherds? Is it really something that you would want to keep to yourself? The effects of their encounters with God's messengers forever changed their life.

I am small town kid from Nebraska who grew up in a Christian home, spending Sunday mornings in our family spot next to the organ. I attended public high school and college encountering friends with various life backgrounds which often led to interesting and sometimes heated discussions about certain differences. All of these things have become a part of my story and they are just a small part, there are so many more events and things that have happened in my life where I have seen God working.

God walks alongside us throughout all of our life experiences, sometimes we are aware of His close presence, other times He seems to be distant but he is always there throughout our lives. How is God a part of your story? What has he done in your life that you can share with others? As Christ-like servant leaders how can we encourage others that maybe walking the same path we are walking or have walked before them.

The shepherders returned and let loose, glorifying and praising God for everything they had heard and seen. It turned out exactly the way they'd been told!" The Message Luke 2:18-20

Silent Night, Holy Night

A band of traveling actors was performing in the little towns of the Austrian Alps in 1818. One night, the actors traveled to the tiny village of Oberndorf, near Salzburg, Austria. They were supposed to perform their recreation of the Christmas story at St. Nicholas Church, but the organ had been damaged and could not be repaired in time. Instead, the program was presented in a private home. St. Nicholas' assistant pastor, Josef Mohr, attended the presentation.

That night, as Mohr walked home, his path took him over a small hill. Looking down on the little village below, he was overtaken by the beauty of the glowing scene and the majestic silence of the wintry night. Standing in the peaceful winter night, his thoughts took him back to the first Christmas when angels spoke to shepherds on a holy night such as this. A poem began to form in his mind, that he would later title "Stille Nacht! Heilige Nacht!"

The pastor quickly wrote down the words to his poem when he arrived home. He wished his poem could be sung at the church's upcoming Christmas service, but he had no music. The following day, Mohr raced to the home of his close friend Franz Gruber, a school master in the village and the church organist. When Gruber read the poem, he remarked, "Friend Mohr, you have found it — the right song — God be praised!" It is said that Gruber composed a musical setting the same day.

On Christmas Day, during a service at St. Nicholas Church, Franz Gruber and Josef Mohr sang their new song to the congregation. The organ had not been repaired, so Gruber accompanied them on his guitar. "Silent Night! Holy Night!" had been sung for the first time.

Within the next few weeks, an organ repairman came to repair the instrument. As soon as he finished his work, Franz Gruber sat down to test the organ. It is reported that the first song he played was his new Christmas composition. Being moved by the music, the repairman took a copy of the song back to his own Alpine village. There, a family of Austrian singers, started singing it throughout the countryside.

The carol became a European favorite. It was translated into English from the Austrian language in 1863 by Jane Campbell, and made its first appearance in America in 1871 in a Sunday school hymnal.

Year after year, we lovingly sing this simple song to our Savior, Jesus Christ.

God's blessings to you all as you celebrate Christmas with your family and friends. May the peace, joy, and excitement of that first Christmas be with you all year long!
